The major part of illiterate are women who score 52% of the whole population. We are promoting literacy in rural areas, in order to support these groups that are disadvantaged; and to help them improve their daily lives, working to plan with them income generating activities, especially for those who will have made the effort in gaining basic knowledge in reading, writing and calculating.

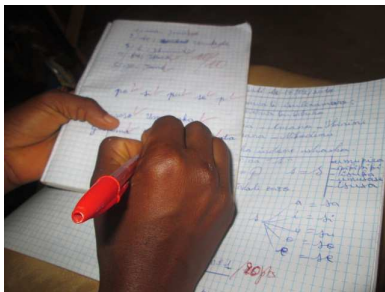
